

Missouri poll data

Polling commissioned by Research!America shows that a clear majority of Missouri residents support research using embryonic stem cells and therapeutic cloning. They would even support a law that allows therapeutic cloning and bans reproductive cloning. The results of this poll are reflective of a national trend that Research!America has been tracking since 2002. In polls conducted nationally and at the state level in Alabama, New Hampshire, North Dakota, and South Dakota, we consistently found that Americans support research using therapeutic cloning but do not support reproductive cloning.

These polls were conducted by Charlton Research Company and Harris Interactive using telephone (random-digit dialing) with a sample size of 800-1000 adults (age 18+) and a maximum theoretical sampling error of +/- 3.5 percent. Data are demographically representative of adult (age 18+) U.S. residents (state or national).
